Abstract

The Furniture Manufacturers Association, Grand Rapids Area, Records, contains a few documents of the predecessor associations that came together in 1911 to form the FMA. These include the Grand Rapids Furniture Manufactures' Association, 1881-1902; the Grand Rapids Furniture Association, 1908-1911; the Grand Rapids Furniture Fraternity, 1908; and the Guild, 1908-1911. But, the collection primarily documents with work of the FMA, including minutes, correspondence and other files of the organization, publications, training materials, photographs, scrapbooks, and some moving images. The bulk of the material dates from after World War I. During the period 1920-1950 the Association took many steps to establish and protect the "Grand Rapids Made" trademark, and the collection contains files of many lawsuits undertaken. Items from the period 1940-1980 document the Association's efforts to train workers, gauge market trends, and comply with the ever-increasing federal and state regulations. As such, these materials give insight into wages, prices, productions and overall economic conditions. The collection also contains material on various efforts to market furniture, primarily through the Grand Rapids Furniture Markets, generally held twice each year until 1964. The photographs document the furniture industry, including furniture trade images, images of various factories both interior and exterior, and of trade events. The Grand Rapids Airplane Company of World War I, which was composed of most of the area furniture manufacturers, is also depicted. That Company made the Handley-Page bombers, none of which ever flew in battle due to the late entry of the United States into the War. A few furniture trade catalogs are found here. See also the separate GRPL Furniture Trade Catalog Collection. 16mm film content **Industry on Parade**, **Sligh Furniture**, and select others, are available in Coll. 175 on videotape. Some separate collections on specific furniture companies are available; ask staff for assistance in locating these.

The FMA Centennial photographs remain in the order established by the FMA. The scrapbook and photograph indexes were created during processing.

History

The Furniture Manufacturers Association (FMA) traces its history back to 1881. A group, with this name, was organized in Grand Rapids to:

- obtain equitable freight rates from the railroads
- protect members from disreputable furniture dealers
- obtain reasonable insurance rates
- protect the Grand Rapids furniture label
- and set uniform wage rates.

This association was never very active during the early years and few records were kept. Following the massive labor strikes of 1911, however, the association reorganized and retained a staff to pursue the Group's intern. The members formed the FMA Warehouse Company in 1920 to negotiate, as a block, for equitable rates with the various railroads. In addition, this group loaded rail cars for the members. As time went on the warehouse Co., expanded into providing supplies for the manufacturers, with profits used to offset cost generated by the manufacturers Association. The directories of the two organizations were tightly inter-locked.

During this same period, the FMA was active in protecting the "Grand Rapids Made" trademark. A series of successful suits were prosecuted against retailers who used "Grand Rapids" in either their names or their advertising without having any Grand Rapids made furniture in their stocks. Also during this period the FMA successfully defended itself against federal anti-trust charges.

Following World War II the FMA also began to concentrate on the problem of the dwindling number of skilled furniture makers. The association began efforts to both recruit and train people for work as furniture makers. During the 1950s these efforts expanded to include providing continuing education for people already employed in the industry. Another effort during this period was collection, assimilation and analysis of market information, to assist members in establishing production goals. These data included economic trends, raw material prices and availability, and wage costs.

Another dimension of the FMA was its market function in promoting Grand Rapids made furniture. This included the predominantly semi-annual markets in Grand Rapids, as well as a whole series of promotional literature and press releases on the city, furniture, furniture industry and personalities involved. During the late 1950s, two films were made documenting the industry one for "Industries on Parade" and the other for the "Arlene Francis Home Show," on television.

In 1981 the FMA celebrated its centennial with an exhibit of furniture similar to the

furniture market exhibits that ended in the early 1960s. The association continues to be an advocate for the industry today, but has expanded its membership to include furniture makers and related industries from West Michigan rather than just Grand Rapids.

Scope and Content

The collection provides insight into trademark protection litigation of the 1920s, 30s and 40s; as well as federal anti trust actions of the 1920s. In addition, the collection documents various economic conditions in the industry such as wage costs, production costs, market trends and shipping costs. Also included are records detailing efforts to recruit, train and keep furniture workers. The photographs show views of factory exteriors and interiors, as well as products of various firms though the views of products generally date to the 1960s and later.

Series III. Corporate Documents, 1914-1973, two folders.

Bylaws and articles of incorporation. Chronological arrangement.

Series IV. Minutes, 1912-1987, 1 cu.ft.

Minutes of annuals meetings and directors meetings document official policy and direction of the association. Chronological arrangement.

Series V. Bulletins, 1953-1985, 2 cu.ft.

Bulletins produced by the FMA and distributed to its members detailing economic conditions such a market trends, raw material availability and costs, wage rates, educational programs and upcoming events. Organized chronologically.

Series VI. Correspondence, 1951-1985, n.d., 5 folders.

Deals with such topics as the furniture museum, continuing education, exports and imports, and correspondence with Gerald R. Ford. Alphabetical organization.

Series VII. Subject File, 1911-1985, 1 cu.ft.

Files on various topics with which the FMA was concerned. Of note are the annual narrative reports from the World War II years; the Finance Committee reports; membership files, marketing activities and safety concerns of the 1960s and 70s. Arranged alphabetically.

Series VIII. Traffic File, 1967-1982, 1/3 cu.ft.

Documents efforts to obtain equitable freight rates and comply with federal freighting requirements. Alphabetical organization.

Series IX. Vocational Education, 1941-1985, 2 cu.ft.

Documents various vocational education workshops sponsored by the FMA. Topics deal with all aspects of the industry from tool grinding through operation of various machinery to repair of damaged furniture. Organized alphabetically by session topic.

Series X. Furniture Technology Program, 1954-1985, 11 folders.

This material evidences several efforts by the FMA to improve the abilities of workers within the industry. These workers included both white-collar and blue collar employees. Arranged alphabetically.

Series XI. Job Evaluation, 1944-1952, n.d. 1/2 cu.ft.

Records of a specialized training program by the FMA to teach managerial skills to people at the foreman level and above. Alphabetically arranged.

Series XII. On-the-Job Training, 1960-67, 8 folders.

Records of a federally funded program of the mid-1960s to improve the skills of specifically selected individuals. Alphabetical organization.

Series XIII. Training Manuals, 1948-76, 1 cu.ft.

Copies of several training manuals created by the FMA, some in both draft and final formats. Several of these manuals were derived from similar manuals produced by the John Widdicomb Company, which are also included. Organized alphabetically.

Series XIV. Recruitment, 1968-69, 6 folders.

Papers on an unsuccessful effort to recruit skilled craftsman from Europe. Organized chronologically.

Series XV. Wages, 1971-82, 1 cu.ft.

Raw data and reports of wage surveys of FMA members by job description, also provided numbers of people employed in each category. Chronological organization.

Series XVI. Legal Files, 1915-77, 1.5 cu.ft.

Correspondence, subpoenas, clipping, transcripts and other legal documents mainly from suits brought by the FMA or on behalf of the FMA to protect the "Grand Rapids Made" trademark. Also included are the FMA files from the 1920s federal anti-trust suits against various furniture manufacturers which unsuccessfully charged price fixing in the industry. Organized alphabetically by suit name.

Series XVII. FTC Trade Practice Rulings, 1930-71, 6 folders.

Various Federal Trade Commission rulings on wood labeling, rayon and other topics pertaining to the furniture industry. Original Order.

Series XVIII. Booklets, 1949-52, n.d., 1/3 cu.ft.

Booklets produced by the FMA on Grand Rapids, Grand Rapids Furniture and related topics; as well as history of a few Grand Rapids manufacturers. Alphabetical by title and also into subseries by topic.

Series XIX. Furniture Museum and Education Center, 1983-5, 11 folders.

The records of a proposal to reuse a Forslund Furniture Building as a FMA museum. This project used funds raised from outside the association and was ultimately determined not to be feasible. Organized alphabetically.

Series XX. Upholstered Furniture Action Council, 1973-82, 11 folders.

Records of this lobbying group on behalf of various manufacturers. Details legislative developments, hearings and policy statements from the Council. Alphabetical arrangement.

Series XXI. FMA Centennial, 1981, 1/3 cu.ft.

Papers, photographs and pictorials from the celebrations includes a furniture display held at the Grand Rapids Public Museum and various pieces of furniture featured in the display. Alphabetical arrangement.

Series XXII. Photographs, 1911-82, n.d., 2 cu.ft.

Photos generated by the FMA and its associated companies. Images depicts factories (exterior and interior) furniture and people. The Grand Rapids Airplane series is particularly noteworthy for its collection of furniture factory exteriors and interiors. Arranged alphabetically by subject heading.

Series XXIII. Scrapbooks, 1905-85, 10 cu.ft.

Scrapbooks collected by the association. Volume 1 contains biographical data on several early furniture makers. Volume 21 deals with the Irwin strike of 1937. Volumes 27 and 28 deal exclusively with the Centennial Furniture Exhibition in 1928. Organized chronologically.
