The Grand Rapids Public Library remains a primary destination for learning new skills and gaining basic knowledge at any stage of life.





Lifelong learning highlights

73,356 picture books were checked out to Grand Rapids' households in 2024. The average retail cost of a picture book is \$19.38.

171 storytimes offered to families last year.


123 consultations provided to job seekers and entrepreneurs.

Connecting our community






The Grand Rapids Public Library serves a vital role in bringing people together to foster a sense of belonging and purpose. In times of individual or collective change, public spaces offer neutral ground where people can come together to learn and be heard.

Each of our 8 neighborhood locations acts as a community hub, promoting social interaction, the exchange of ideas, and civic cohesion-essential elements for maintaining a healthy social infrastructure.

The partnerships we've developed with local organizations and agencies makes us a destination for those seeking assistance. Beyond facilitating dialogue, the library becomes a bridge to a network of resources and social services across the city.

As an extension of our efforts, GRPL's Mobile Library delivers targeted services to neighborhoods with limited access to resources. Through strategic deployment, we can address early literacy gaps and deepen our engagement with the communities we serve.







Community highlights

495,245 library visits in 2024. That's over 1,400 visitors each day.

15 local service agencies have regular presence or office hours at the library. Areas of focus include housing, healthcare, education, literacy, and mental health


241 residents were provided support by social service agencies through connections made at the library.

Celebrating our collection

Our collection of books, movies, music, and databases are the bedrock of our institution. Over 1 million materials are checked out each year, regardless of format, which underscores the importance of our library's expansive collection to our community.

Our materials reflect the people within the neighborhoods we serve and through intentional acquisitions, we help our patrons discover new perspectives, explore real and imagined worlds, and stay informed. The connections we make to our collections through time honored traditions like our Summer Reading Challenge and book clubs, help inspire the next generation of readers.


Collection highlights

On average, borrowers check out 40 items each year, a savings of **\$1,161** per person.

2,295 archival items were viewed by local patrons as well as people from 86 cities, 20 states or provinces, and 100 zip codes.


8,772 kids and adults participated in the Summer Reading Challenge.

Digital circulation 618,113






