i. GRCM Collaboration

McNaughton states that GRPL and the City have finished their portions of the MOU and the Children's Museum is still working on their portion, which is due May 1.

ii. GRPL + GREIU Contract Negotiations

McNaughton states they have met 3 times and they are currently discussing economics. Their next meeting is May 6.

Anderson comments on the story of 120 people learning how to crochet at the GRPL program.

This funding will support the Poet Laureate, Hispanic Heritage, and Native American Heritage programs. It will also allow for the purchase of more eBooks and local history materials, and cover the majority of the annual payment for the Grand Rapids Press Historical Archives database. The GRPLF Board is appreciative to library staff for the detailed grant requests and evaluations that were submitted."

Strategic Framework Project Updates

- On April 17, the Small Business Resource Center was host to SpringGR Emprende, a Spanish speaking entrepreneurship education program from SpringGR. The Business and Career Librarian was able to teach the class in Spanish thanks to translation from Maria Erazo, the program's leader and educator. The class covered all the resources we have here at the library, as well as research tips for different stages of business planning.
- A patron who the Resource Navigator had been working with for several weeks around housing and employment was excited to provide an update that they recently attained both.
- There were three situations in which patrons experienced suicidal ideation during the month of April. The circumstances were different for each situation, but all involved multiple staff members responding in a calm, empathetic, and pragmatic way while very effectively working together. Patrons were able to connect with timely resources in all three situations.

CREATING INSPIRING SPACES & EXPERIENCES



• Artist and Adult Services Manager Nic Coppernoll led Introduction to Abstract Portraits at the Main Library. This two-hour program began with Nic explaining how drawing contour lines of a subject without picking up the drawing instrument and without looking at the paper can increase skill by training the eye to draw what it sees. After a quick demonstration, all twenty attendees practiced drawing each other using continuous contour lines. Nic then shared examples of abstract portraits. Patrons spent the majority of the time creating their own portraits to take home.



Feedback of the event was exceptional, with

those in attendance sharing how grateful they were for the class and requesting that we have more art classes. One couple drove from Holland just for the event; another was visiting and wrote in the class survey, "We are here from Baltimore Maryland & this was an amazing way to spend part of our trip to GR!" One patron wrote, "This was a phenomenal class. Nic was an



, excellent instructor and we had so much fun! Please do more of these."

Several patrons couldn't attend due to capacity limitations, but 5 of those people (who had not known each other prior) decided to sit at a table and create artwork together!

- The Youth Services Department at the Main Library has had our Mamava lactation pod for almost one year. This past quarter, we doubled our usage from the previous quarter.
- During Spring Break, all of our locations were taken over by little ones and their grown-ups exclaiming
 joyfully about Bluey (an Australian cartoon about a Blue Heeler and her friends and family). Each location
 had a character seek and find, a photo op with Bluey and Bingo, and some fun crafts. Throughout the week,
 staff across the system were sharing fun and heartwarming moments overheard in the children's areas.
 Here are a few fun stories from some of our locations:
 - More Spring Break busy-ness! It continues to be such a joy to watch kids excitedly do the Bluey Seek & Find. Shouts of "it's Bingo!" and "I found Pom-Pom!" echoing through the department. Also "It's Chilli...she was on the door the whole time!" - Main Library
 - One kiddo kept saying, "teamwork makes the dream work!" while completing the Bluey Seek & Find with others. Another patron let us know that her son who is autistic loves Bluey and would love to participate in our Bluey activities, however he gets intimidated by large crowds/other kids. They said, "it's really nice for people who don't travel for break to have something like this to do." Seymour Branch
 - Hearing kiddos call out for the Bluey characters as they do the Seek & Find is peak cuteness. You'll just hear "Muffiiiiin! Aunt Trixiiiie!" in the stacks as they look around. - Van Belkum Branch
 - Adults and little ones have been dressing up as "grannies" and having their picture snapped alongside Bluey and Bingo. Feedback from both adults and kids about the Spring Break programming has been very positive. One little patron (about 4 years old) excitedly ran up to Jason and repeated several times, "I need a hint" as he worked on the Seek & Find. - West Leonard Branch
 - The Bluey Seek & Find activity was a huge success all week. One young patron wanted to do it a second time cause that's his thing! Yankee Clipper Branch
- Led by the Communications Department and a core team, a self-service point signage project was completed. This project uncovered root-cause navigation challenges across the system and the findings from the root-cause navigation challenges informed the creation of enhanced, bilingual design solutions for key self-service points to ensure a more intuitive patron experience.

In addition, the project resulted in the following:

- Privacy Solutions: Privacy enhancements at select branch locations (GN, GS, GO) to improve public spaces and provide a better staff experience when off-desk.
- **Signage Index**: A guide for staff detailing the approved signs available throughout the system, including best practices for posting these signs to ensure optimal visibility.
- Promotional Posters, Stands, & Guidelines: Posters & updated holders (replacing wooden easels) are deployed across the system to highlight library offerings. Fresh posters are added annually and locations are encouraged to rotate displays monthly for neighborhood-specific engagement.



• **Passive Programming Templates**: Templates for use across the system.

- **Wall Hanging Literature Racks**: Racks at all locations to hold GRPL booklets, minimizing "visual clutter" on table tops.
- The Communications Department in partnership with Librarian Erin Antes, launched an eNewsletter to patrons who signed up for a library card via the Mobile Library's route last year in order to help inform our community of this season's route.
- The Communications Department collaborated with the Information Services Department to update Check Out Station screens across the system after identifying that they are a primary point of confusion for patrons. The monitors now indicate that they are touch screens and feature a custom design to differentiate them from other monitors.



• The Communications Department has completed this year's Summer Reading campaign—one of our largest annual projects. The campaign includes bilingual booklets, yard signs, banners, billboards, streaming and cable videos, social media reels, webpages, graphics, eNewsletters, coloring sheets, posters, display signs, digital ads, stickers, prizes, and more. With strong staff support hand-selling the program, this effort plays a key role in helping the library meet its engagement goals each year.



TRANSFORMING OUR CULTURE

- The Patron Services Department collaborated with the Community Support & Safety Department to provide a new training for Library Pages related to patron behavior after identifying a need in existing Library Page training. 15 Library Pages at the Main Library opted into receiving this training, which highlighted patron rule-breaking behaviors that staff may see during their shift and how to appropriately respond to them. In the future, this training will be provided during the onboarding process for all new Library Page staff.
- Spring Staff Day was a large success this year. The trainings staff received at Spring Staff Day on May 14 were *Know Your Rights*, provided by the City of Grand Rapids Office of Oversight and Public Accountability, and *Resiliency*, provided by Dr. Sarah Reed. During the Connect & Recharge portion of the day, staff had an opportunity to play board games, complete puzzles, interact with the miniature service horse Freckle Butt Fred from Little Horses Big Smiles, as well as meet with their departments as a whole team. A few comments from staff regarding their favorite parts of the day were:
 - "Getting to connect with staff members from other locations."

- "...I also really liked the resiliency training and even if I didn't feel like it was groundbreaking for me in particular, it's always good to be reminded of coping mechanisms."
- "Connect & Recharge. Initially the unstructured time made me anxious, but it turned out to be the perfect way to end the day and spend time with other staff that didn't feel pressured."
- *"Freckle Butt Fred was the highlight of my week."*
- "Best Staff Day yet. Great pace. I loved having lots of time to relax in our public spaces with people from all over GRPL. Great food. Good presentations."






Items Borrowed by Fiscal Year and Month (includes both physical and digital items)




Physical Items Borrowed by Branch



Library Visits by Branch




Public Computer Use by Branch
